As our fiscal year began (July 1, 2019), your Education Foundation continued to expand its programs and add more schools to Red Apple Supplies. Until February or March, this would have been

a pretty standard "Greeting from CEO" in an annual report. And then, everything changed...

As January turned to February, we began monitoring the global spread of something called COVID-19. As February turned to March, the disease began hitting America cities. And then, on March 13th, our Superintendent made the difficult decision to shift to "remote learning" once the students returned from Spring Break. In that moment, education was forever changed in Palm Beach County.

It would have been easy for us to stand pat...take a "wait and see attitude". But if you think that was ever a possibility, you haven't met our staff! In a matter of weeks, your Education Foundation completely re-imagined and transformed our day-to-day operations so that we could continue to serve our students, teachers and schools. Every program was transformed into a "virtual" program. Red Apple Supplies shifted to preparing and delivering Kits for Kids.

As our fiscal year closed on June 30th, the numbers told the story. In 2019-2020, your Education Foundation... • increased the number of schools we serve at Red Apple Supplies from 43 to 53 • distributed over \$656,000 of school supplies through Red Apple Supplies • increased the number of GoTeach! Grants from 62 to 94 • received a grant from The Frederick A. DeLuca Foundation to establish a Cybersecurity Academy at Santaluces Community H.S. in 2020-2021 • was awarded a Four-Star Rating from Charity Navigator for the second consecutive year • partnered with the SDPBC and Comcast to host the Annual Principal of the Year Celebration • partnered with the SDPBC, Publix Supermarkets and the United Way of Palm Beach County for the annual Tools for Schools • pivoted operations at Red Apple Supplies distributing over 5,000 Kits for Kids totaling over \$100,000 • ensured educational equity and access as a top

priority (COVID-19 response, Kits for Kids, Device Drive, Rise to the Challenge, etc.) Oh yes...we also helped the School District raise and donate over \$60,000 to the Red Cross to assist with recovery efforts in the Bahamas, after the devastation of Hurricane Dorian, while providing backpacks with school supplies to the students from the Bahamas who relocated to Palm Beach County.



The Education Foundation of Palm Beach County completed the fourth full year of operations for the Red Apple Supplies (RAS) program. RAS is a teacher resource store that provides FREE school supplies for students attending designated Title 1 schools. Since opening its door, RAS has distributed over \$1.5 million in free supplies.

### ➤ Impact:

- 37,985+ students and 53 schools served
- \$656,000+ in FREE school supplies distributed

The Education Foundation of Palm Beach County's GoTeach!
Classroom Grants encourage educators to create innovative
and exciting educational opportunities for their students
and focus on these priority areas: Literacy, Career Education,
College Readiness and STEAM (Science, Technology,
Engineering, Art and Mathematics).

#### ➤ Impact:

- \$110,000 awarded to fund 94 grants
- 60+ schools,140 teachers and over 19,000 students served

#### **CLOSING THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP WITH AVID**

Funded in partnership with Bank of America and the School
District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of
Florida Education Foundations.

The AVID System (Advancement via Individual Determination) is a district-wide academic and graduation improvement initiative supported by the Education Foundation of Palm Beach County. The AVID program's mission is to close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society.

#### **➤** Impact:

- 67,000 students and 66 schools served (an increase of 10 new AVID schools this year)
- 800 teachers and administrators trained in research-based instructional strategies
- 93% of AVID program graduates met four-year college entrance requirements

### CHARGING FORWARD WITH MULTISENSORY STRATEGIES

Funded in partnership with Ventus Charitable Foundation and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

This pilot program serves to meet The School District of Palm Beach County's Strategic Plan's goal by providing effective and relevant instruction to meet the needs of all students and increase the number of students reading on grade level by 3rd grade. In collaboration with the University of Central Florida's Morgridge International Reading Center, the School District of Palm Beach County has trained district administrators and teachers in research-based instructional strategies impacting the quality of their instruction.

### **➤ Impact:**

- · 2,679 students and 12 schools served
- 77% of kindergarten and 85% of first grade students demonstrated mastery on their Reading Running Record Year-End Assessment

#### **ROCKET POWERED ROBOTICS**

Funded in partnership with Aerojet Rocketdyne Foundation and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

The Rocket Powered Robotics program supports teams competing in the FIRST Lego League and First Tech Challenge Robotics programs in Palm Beach County. This program produces champion design teams rooted in the disciplines of STEM education. The goal of this program is to provide student access to robotics education that develops critical thinking skills centered on principles of technology and engineering in order to compete at District, Regional and State competitions.

#### ➤ Impact:

• 4 robotics teams and over 140 students served

#### **HEALTHCARE INNOVATION PROJECT**

Funded in partnership with Quantum Foundation and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

In an effort to foster post-graduate success, this 2-year collaborative project with the School District of Palm Beach County provided Medical Sciences Academy programs with cutting-edge diverse clinical patient simulators. This specialized equipment provided students with hands-on learning opportunities, allowing them to fulfill the clinical experiences required to receive industry certifications to become professional healthcare providers.

### **➤ Impact:**

- 6,000+ students served
- 97% of Medical Academy students successfully passed and earned an industry certification prior to high school graduation, allowing them the opportunity to seek and/or obtain employment in healthcare and/or STEM-related careers
- Industry Certifications Include: Emergency Medical Responder, Certified Medical Administrative Assistant, Certified EKG Technician, Certified Patient Care Technician, Certified Pharmacy Technician, Certified Nursing Assistant, and Certified Personal Trainer



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#### **STEPPING UP STEM IN PAHOKEE**

Funded in partnership with Ventus Charitable Foundation and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

Stepping up STEM in Pahokee is a Computer Programming and Robotics program offering specialized courses that create a pipeline for 6-10th graders at Pahokee Middle Senior High School. Skills learned in the classes closely resemble what is currently being used by today's professionals in the industry. These hand-on instructional opportunities prepare students for success in academics and increase their exposure and interest in pursuing STEM-related careers.

### **➤ Impact:**

- 54 students served
- First Computer Programming and Robotics Courses offered at the high school level





### ORKIDS PROJECT: UNDERSTANDING THE IMPORTANCE OF CONSERVATION SCIENCE

Funded in partnership with Ventus Charitable Foundation and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

OrKids, in partnership with Florida Atlantic University's
Pine Jog Environmental Education Center, is a hands-on
plant propagation program that provided the opportunity
for middle and high school students to grow endangered
native orchids in their classroom botany lab while collecting
important data that helped to inform the scientific field on
native plant conservation. Students learned the concepts of
habitat restoration, endangered species care and protection,
through the hands-on experiences of caring for the orchids and
restoration project.

### ➤ Impact:

- 229 students from 10 classes at Congress Middle School and Palm Beach Central High School learned how to think critically about the plant world in their class Orchid Botony Lab
- 4 teachers were provided training and, in total, received 640 orchids for their classrooms

### ALLAMANDA ACCESS FOR ALL ON THE PATH TO ARTS INCLUSION FOR CHILDREN WITH AUTISM

Funded in partnership with Allamanda Access for ALL PTA fundraiser and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

This program provided specialized instruction for students on the autism spectrum previously identified as needing individual support in Fine Arts classes. Students received opportunities to practice skills needed to work towards full inclusion in their Fine Arts courses with reduced class size. A highly qualified and professionally certified instructor worked to embed cultural competence and equity and access into the curriculum by utilizing individualized strategies to meet the needs of every learner.

### **➤ Impact:**

- Served 144 students on the autism spectrum
- Reduced class size to a 1:12 student to teacher ratio

### GLOBAL COLLABORATIONS FOR PROJECT BASED LEARNING

Funded in partnership with the Mary and Robert Pew Public Education Fund and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

Through Project Based Learning, this program facilitated the engagement of two schools in a pedagogy that focused on collaborative reflection with an emphasis on understanding world problems from the local to the global stage. Jupiter Elementary created a plan for broadening understanding of environmental issues and Melaleuca Elementary followed the theme of diplomacy and conflict resolution. Students and teachers collaborated with other students and teachers located in Ecuador and Zimbabwe using Genius Plaza Software. The project with Ecuador was particularly significant, with students learning about and comparing the Galapagos and Everglades ecosystems. In both schools, students presented their ideas for supporting their action plans and volunteered throughout the community by sharing their ideas, promoting advocacy for the environment, and supported their presentations with detailed research.

### **➤ Impact:**

- 1200 students served at Melaleuca and Jupiter Elementary Schools
- Students' final projects were presented at the Global Education Showcase at Jupiter Elementary School



### **Foundation Supported Programs**

#### LEADERSHIP AND EDUCATOR COLLABORATIVE

Funded by: The Jim Moran Foundation.

Through a series of trainings held at The Conservatory School in North Palm Beach, the Leadership and Educator Collaborative provided teachers, administrators, and school district leaders professional development and specialized training on a student-centered pedagogy, Project Based Learning.

### ➤ Impact:

- · A total of 258 teachers and administrators trained
- Over 4,500 students and 9 schools served since project began in January of 2019



#### **EMPOWERING STEM EDUCATORS**

Funded by: Florida Power & Light Company in partnership with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

FPL's EmPOWERing STEM Educators program increased teacher knowledge of effective math and science instructional practices aligned with Florida Standards.

#### ➤ Impact:

- Over 90% of participating teachers reported an increase in knowledge of STEM instructional delivery
- 40 teachers trained from 11 participating schools

#### **MOTOROLA STEM SOLUTIONS GRANT**

Funded by: Motorola Solutions Foundation in partnership with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

### FARMBOT TO TABLE: USING ROBOTS TO FEED FAMILIES\*

This project empowered students to connect STEM-related concepts learned in Engineering and Agrotechnology courses to develop strategies to solve the global food insecurity crisis which impacts the rural community in which students at Glades Central Community High School live. Students prepared for the planning, design, build, and maintenance of outdoor gardens and indoor hydroponic gardens using a Farmbot. Students gained hands-on experience and learned about STEM related careers by collaborating with local business partners through various experiential field trips and guest speakers.

### ➤ Impact:

- 100 students served
- Students harvested their crops and sold their produce at a local farmers market where they educated the community on sustainable farming
- \*Program still in progress as a result of COVID-19

### LIGHTING THE WAY TO COLLEGE IN RIVIERA BEACH: FLORIDA LOTTERY

Funded by: Florida Lottery in partnership with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

This college readiness program at Riviera Beach Prep provided a free ACT/SAT preparation course, study materials, covered the cost for students to take the ACT/SAT, paid for students to participate in college tours, and paid for college application fees for students that met the criteria to apply. In addition, this program provided additional guidance services, mentoring, support and accountability for students and families in terms of students' academic progress towards graduation.

### **➤ Impact:**

- 135 students participated in 5-day intensive ACT/SAT prep course
- 21 students passed the ACT Reading Sub-Test
- ACT/SAT pass rate increased by 7 % from 29% in 2018-2019 to 36% in 2019-2020

### SUPPORTING TEACHERS TO ACCELERATE READERS' SUCCESS (STARS)

Funded by: TD Charitable Foundation, the charitable giving arm of TD Bank, America's Most Convenient Bank®.

In partnership with the School District of Palm Beach County, this pilot program provided strategic support to ensure focus on building capacity around guided reading instruction with kindergarten and first grade teachers at Orchard View Elementary School. By providing professional development that incorporates research-based instructional strategies and specialized resources and classroom materials, this literacy program aligns with the School District of Palm Beach County's long-term outcome to increase the number of students reading on grade level by 3rd grade.



### ➤ Impact:

- 75 students served
- 97% of participating kindergarten students demonstrated an increase in learning gains as measured by their performance on the I-Ready Reading Diagnostic Assessment when comparing their baseline assessment score from Fall of 2019 to Fall of 2020

#### **AT&T STEM @WORK GRANT PROGRAMS**

Funded by: AT&T in partnership with the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

### BOYNTON BEACH HIGH SCHOOL AEROSPACE SCIENCE ACADEMY: DRONE BUILD AND FLIGHT\*

This project was designed to enrich Boynton Beach High School's Aerospace Academy students' knowledge of drone regulations, procedures, assembly, construction, and flying which prepared students to perform well on industry certification exams. Students gained hands on practical experience and applied STEM and course concepts.

### CROSSPOINTE ELEMENTARY SKELETAL SYSTEM ANATOMY ASSEMBLY\*

This project was designed to increase students' knowledge of the human anatomy, in particular the skeletal system.

Students learned to identify, label, and assemble the basic bone structures of the human skeletal system.

### ➤ Collective Impact:

- 320 students and 2 schools served
- \*Program still in progress as a result of COVID-19

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**Expanding our Impact** in the Community

> and students, a check in the amount of \$43,555 was presented to the American Red Cross on September 25, 2019. In addition to making donations on the GoFundMe account, schools answered the call to action and launched fundraisers to support the campaign. 

### School District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program Information

Through the collaborative effort of its members, the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations (CFEF) successfully advocated for the creation of legislative matching funds in 2000 which has provided a dollar-for-dollar incentive for local education foundations to raise private contributions for eligible projects. Since then, nearly \$102 million in combined private and state dollars have been employed for local projects that serve low-performing students and literacy initiatives, encourage STEM and career/technical education, improve teaching quality, and/or increase graduation rates.

The CFEF is the membership organization for Florida's school district-wide local education foundations. Established in 1987, the

CFEF maximizes the individual and collective strength of Florida local education foundations to support local partners and schools in achieving student success. The CFEF now has 64-member foundations with 1,200 business and community leaders serving as volunteer board members. Collectively, they raise \$64 million annually to support students, teachers and schools through a variety of programs. The CFEF has facilitated more than \$51 million to local education foundations since 2002 through various private-and public-sector partnerships, including the State of Florida School District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program.




