The Education Foundation of Palm Beach County completed the third full year of operations for its signature program, Red Apple Supplies (RAS). RAS is a resource store that provides teachers with FREE school supplies for students attending designated Title 1 schools. Since opening its door, RAS has distributed over \$1 million in free supplies.

GoTeach! CLASSROOM GRANTS


Funded by: Great Charity Challenge, SRG Technology, the "Support Education" License Plate Program and School District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program through The Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

The Education Foundation of Palm Beach County's GoTeach! Classroom Grants encourage educators to create innovative and exciting educational opportunities for their students. GoTeach! Classroom Grants focus on these priority areas: Literacy, Career Education and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics). The typical GoTeach! Classroom Grant ranges from \$225 -\$775 (for individual teacher proposals) to \$1,000 (for team proposals).

➤ Impact:

- \$67,000 awarded to fund 62 grants
- 40+ schools served
- 14,000+ students impacted
- 100+ teachers supported and 95% of teachers reported an increase in teacher quality as a result of their grant participation

CHARGING FORWARD WITH MULTISENSORY STRATEGIES

Funded by: Ventus Charitable Foundation and the School
District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program
through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

This program was designed to align with The School District of Palm Beach County's Strategic Plan to provide effective and relevant instruction to meet the needs of all students and to increase the number of students reading on grade level by 3rd grade.

In collaboration with the University of Central Florida's Morgridge International Reading Center, the School District of Palm Beach County has trained district administrators and teachers in research-based instructional strategies that developed the capacity for teachers to impact the quality of their instruction. In its second year, this pilot reading program served 4 schools. Instructional strategies were used to improve students' reading proficiency in primary grades with language-based learning disabilities, including students with characteristics of dyslexia.

➤ Impact:

- · 988 students and 4 schools served
- 47 teachers and 10 administrators trained in researchbased strategies
- 100% of teachers reported an improvement in teacher quality as a result of participating in multisensory instructional strategies training
- 81% of Kindergarten and 90% of First Grade students demonstrated mastery on their Reading Running Record Year-End Assessment

CLOSING THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP WITH AVID



The AVID System (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is a district-wide academic and graduation improvement initiative supported by the Education Foundation of Palm Beach County based upon its superior student outcomes. The AVID program's mission is to close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society. AVID has proven results in 56 local elementary, middle and high schools resulting in grade and credit improvement, higher graduation rates among under-performing gender and racial groups, and more students enrolled and persisting in post-secondary education. This program provided essential training to AVID elective teachers and district/school leaders to ensure that research-based instructional strategies were taught in AVID electives and in AVID schools in order to prepare first-generation college-bound students for graduation and post-secondary success.

AVID Senior Demographics



- 60,000+ students and 56 schools served
- 700 teachers and administrators trained in research-based instructional strategies
- 100% of AVID Seniors graduated in the Class of 2019
- Conniston Middle School was deemed the first National Demonstration School in South Florida.



HEALTHCARE INNOVATION PROJECT

Funded by: The Quantum Foundation and the School District Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

In an effort to foster post-graduate success, the Healthcare Innovation Project was designed as a collaborative effort between the School District of Palm Beach County and the Education Foundation of Palm Beach County. This project provided 13 Medical Sciences Academy Programs with cutting-edge diverse clinical patient simulators that teachers and students programmed with "pre-existing medical conditions". This cutting-edge equipment provided students with hands-on learning opportunities, allowing them to fulfill the clinical experiences required to receive industry certifications in order to become professional healthcare providers.

➤ Impact:

- 4,500+ students and 13 schools served
- 42 teachers trained
- Based on preliminary results, 99% of Medical Academy students successfully passed and earned an industry certification prior to high school graduation, allowing them the opportunity to seek and/or obtain employment in healthcare and/or STEM-related careers
- Industry Certifications Included: Emergency Medical Responder, Certified Medical Administrative Assistant, Certified EKG Technician, Certified Patient Care Technician, Certified Pharmacy Technician, Certified Nursing Assistant and Certified Personal Trainer

ROCKET POWERED ROBOTICS

Funded by Aerojet Rocketdyne Foundation and the School
District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program
through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

The Rocket Powered Robotics program supported teams competing in the FIRST LEGO League and FIRST Tech Challenge Robotics programs in Palm Beach County. This program produced champion design teams rooted in the disciplines of STEM education. It provided targeted support to teams with participating students from over 14 district schools. One middle and high school in the far western Glades community, where access to robotics clubs drastically improved STEM participation and interest in STEM-related careers, was also supported through this program. The goal of this program was to provide students access to robotics education that stimulated knowledge and developed critical thinking skills. This was centered on principles of technology and engineering through opportunities allowing students to work cooperatively as a team to problem-solve and compete in FIRST Lego League Competitions.

➤ Impact:

- 4 robotics teams, 100 students and 16 teachers served
- The Children of the Swamp team competed at the World Championship where they won in their division and placed 4th overall
- M.A.R.S. (Mega Awesome Robotic System) competed at the Orlando and South Florida Regional Competitions and were selected as members of an alliance in both competitions
- Pahokee Middle School, the Subaroos, caught the attention of the University of Washington and even NASA!

STEPPING UP STEM IN PAHOKEE

Funded by: Ventus Charitable Foundation and the School
District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program
through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

Stepping up STEM in Pahokee helped create a pipeline of Computer Programming/Robotics and Marine & Environmental Science course offerings in order to increase skill development and opportunities for middle school students. The change in school curriculum challenged students with more complex concepts that most closely resemble what is currently being used by today's professionals in STEM fields. These opportunities prepared students for success in STEM courses and increased student interest in STEM-related careers.

➤ Impact:

- 144 students and 3 teachers served
- New Marine and Environmental Science courses provided for students

Foundation Supported Programs

FIRE SCIENCE ACADEMY AT PALM BEACH LAKES COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL

Funded by: JPMorgan Chase & Co.

The Fire Science Academy at Palm Beach Lakes Community High School is a newly developed, 4-year Career and Technical Choice Academy providing students the opportunity to graduate with a high school diploma and earn two industry certifications (Firefighter I and Emergency Medical Responder) leading to opportunities for postgraduation employment.

The Fire Science Academy also provides the pathway and preparation for entry into post-secondary fire academies, with a matriculation agreement in place for eligible students to transition smoothly into the Fire Academy at Palm Beach State College. In addition to providing non-college bound students with the opportunity to train for a sustainable career, this program will increase the diversity in local fire departments by encouraging minority students to train for a career in this field.

- 55 students served and anticipated enrollment of 30 additional students each year
- Students received hands-on training (including local ambulance ride-along, fire engine simulation training, advanced patient clinical simulators)




LEADERSHIP AND EDUCATOR COLLABORATIVE

Funded by: The Jim Moran Foundation

The Leadership and Educator Collaborative provided teachers, administrators and school district leaders professional development and specialized training on a student-centered pedagogy, Project Based Learning. Participants learned how to develop critical thinkers through engagement of

students in more authentic learning that required solving real-world problems through a series of trainings held at The Conservatory School at North Palm Beach.

- 258 teachers, administrators and community leaders trained
- 9 schools served
- 4,500 students impacted



EMPOWERING STEM EDUCATORS

Funded by: Florida Power & Light Company in partnership with Aerojet Rocketdyne Foundation.

The purpose of FPL's EmPOWERing STEM Educators program is to increase teacher knowledge of effective math and science instructional practices which align with Florida Standards. This professional development program took place at The Conservatory School at North Palm Beach. These trainings provided teachers throughout the school district the opportunity to engage in peer-to-peer learning of highly effective instructional techniques.

➤ Impact:

- 93% of participating teachers reported that this program gave them the opportunity to observe and learn from highly effective peer teachers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) related subjects
- 43 teachers trained from 10 participating schools

CONNECTING SOCIAL JUSTICE & STEM USING GIS AT VILLAGE ACADEMY

Funded by: Motorola Solutions Foundation in partnership with Aerojet Rocketdyne Foundation.

Through the use of Geographic Information System
Technology (GIS), students were able to create solutions
for real world challenges that impact their own community.
Students used state-of-the-art 21st Century Technology to
drive their inquiry-based learning using ESRI (Environmental
Science Research Institute) ArcGIS Technology. Students
were tasked to choose from two tracks: Environmental
or Health & Safety. Using ArcGIS Technology gave them
a broader perspective in these two subject areas which
helped them to understand ESRI's Trademark of the "Science



of Where". Students learned first-hand how to leverage multiple pieces of software tools to fully comprehend the power of GIS which, in turn, helped them learn how to provide solutions to help their community address the Drug/Opioid Epidemic crisis and Explore the Green Infrastructure. This program incorporated engineering, IT concepts, public safety elements and vocational skills, and provided information to help students ultimately obtain their industry certification in IT/GIS areas. The project targeted under-represented groups - primarily students living at or below the poverty line, minority students and females.

Students attended multiple field trips as well as participated in presentations at the school to help them understand what it means to choose a career in STEM through the use of GIS Technology.

- 71 students served
- 81.5% of participating students increased STEM-subject grade by one full letter grade

Pahokee Middle School Students Making their Mark in the Science Community

NASA shows interest in the work of students learning robotics and coding through STEM programs funded through the Education Foundation of Palm Beach County, Ventus Charitable Foundation, Aerojet Rocketdyne Foundation and the School District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program through the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations.

The students on the Subaroos Robotics Team at Pahokee Middle School found a way to treat kidney stones in space,

one of the big problems facing NASA astronauts. After creating the idea, the students received input from researchers at the University of Washington.

One of the students at Pahokee Middle School, Alondra Campos, shared, that "Robotics impacts my life, future



career plans, and aspirations for college. Before I was in robotics, I wanted to become an anesthesiologist, but now I want to be an engineer to be able to build devices that can help people. Robotics has changed my point of view because I can create robots that may assist the doctor when doing surgery or can create robotic arms that can connect to the nerves in the brain. A place I would want to work at is NASA because they inspired me in many ways by the support they gave to us to create our project to destroy kidney stones from the body." Alondra and other students participating in this program are now future scientists in the making, all because they were given the opportunities to explore, create and learn through a grant supported by the Education Foundation of Palm Beach County and the philanthropic and business community. This is one of the many success stories that are possible when the community rallies to support education in Palm Beach County.

School District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program Information

Through the collaborative effort of its members, the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations (CFEF) successfully advocated for the creation of legislative matching funds in 2000 which has provided a dollar-for-dollar incentive for local education foundations to raise private contributions for eligible projects. Since then, nearly \$102 million in combined private and state dollars have been employed for local projects that serve low-performing students and literacy initiatives, encourage STEM and career/technical education, improve teaching quality, and/or increase graduation rates.

The CFEF is the membership organization for Florida's school district-wide local education foundations. Established in 1987, the CFEF maximizes the individual and collective strength of

Florida local education foundations to support local partners and schools in achieving student success. The CFEF now has 64-member foundations with 1,200 business and community leaders serving as volunteer board members. Collectively, they raise \$64 million annually to support students, teachers and schools through a variety of programs. The CFEF has facilitated more than \$51 million to local education foundations since 2002 through various private- and public-sector partnerships, including the State of Florida School District Education Foundation Matching Grant Program.




